

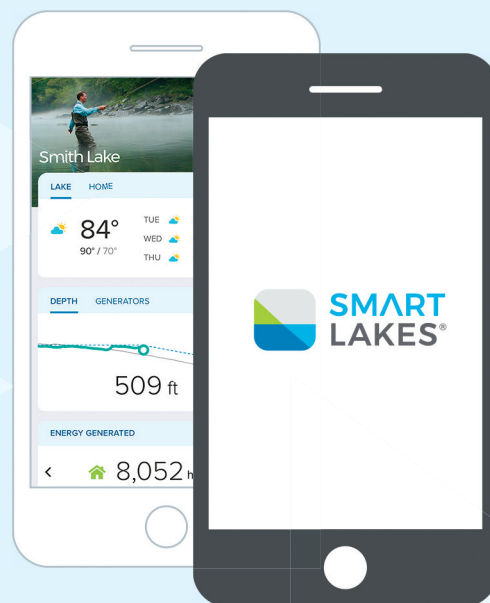

The Preserves

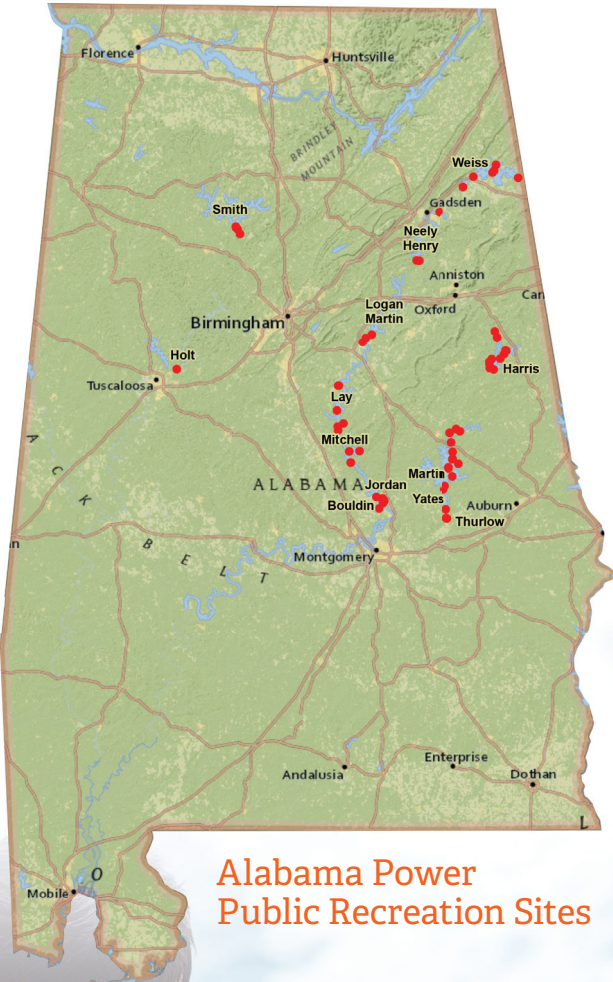
The nature of the Alabama Power land holdings lend themselves to extensive green and natural spaces that can play host to and offer a variety of unique outdoor activities. From hiking, biking, and birding to pulling up to a public dock in an unspoiled cove, The Preserves are core to the Alabama Power ideal of merging nature with crafting special places. These lands allow people to enjoy, learn, and grow a deeper appreciation of our state's ecology and natural landscape. They allow our citizens to access and enjoy our lakes. They are inclusive and open to all. The Preserves are located all over our service territory and can be expansive tracts designed for people to hike, bike, and explore or they can be small and tucked lakeside for family picnics and special events. Some will have playgrounds while others will provide boat access to the lakes they sit alongside.



Hunting opportunities for people with physical disabilities

Alabama's Hunting & Fishing Trail for People with Physical Disabilities is a network of public and private recreational sites throughout the state providing accessible fishing, shooting, and hunting opportunities for individuals with physical disabilities. The trail was developed by the Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources in cooperation with Alabama Power and other partners.

There are three such sites within Alabama Power Project boundaries: Lewis Smith Management Area in Walker County; R.L. Harris Management Area in Randolph County; and Jordan Management Area in Elmore County. Lifejacket Safety

Lifejackets must be

- U.S. Coast Guard approved.
- In good and serviceable condition.
- The appropriate size for the intended user.
- Worn by children under 8 years old.
- Worn by anyone on a personal watercraft or being towed on skis/tube.
- Worn by anyone within 800 feet below a hydroelectric dam or navigational lock or dam.

Heat Safety

- Drink more fluids.
- Don't drink liquids that contain alcohol or large amounts of sugar.
- Protect yourself from the sun by wearing a wide-brimmed hat, sunglasses, and sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher.
- Wear lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.
